



RUSM SHELTER RULES FOR LESC

If you are sheltering on campus (LESC) please note the following shelter rules and guidelines:

- Ensure you register with security at the reception area of the LESC upon arrival.
- You will be required to take a temperature test due to the current COVID-19 pandemic.
- Ensure you are wearing a mask to protect our community against COVID-19.
- Observe the CDC guidelines, including the social distancing protocol of six feet apart. Wash and sanitize your hands regularly.
- Please ensure that any children or immediate family members you take with you to the RUSM Shelter are properly supervised by you.
- You are solely responsible for security of your important documents: passport, visa, insurance cards, and credit cards. Store papers in a zip lock bag.
- Carry with you a pillow, blanket and/or sleeping bag, food, and change of clothing for two days, personal hygiene toiletries including soap and a bath towel, medication, non-electronic entertainment such as cards and books, flashlights (no candles), hand sanitizer, and extra face masks.
- **NO ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED AT THE SHELTER.**
- **NO PETS ARE ALLOWED AT THE SHELTER.**
- Once on campus, do not go outside until you have been advised it is safe to do so by Ross Security. Stay away from windows and doors during the storm.
- Do not leave the shelter until Ross Security has given the all-clear and you have checked out with the Shelter Manager.
- Once on campus please stay within the designated areas as identified by the shelter manager/s or security.
- After the storm, do not drive until advised it is safe. You should never attempt to drive through flooded areas.

DO NOT GO OUTSIDE DURING STORM. Monitor storm advisories and stay inside until advised that it is safe to leave. The eye of the storm gives a perception that the storm has passed but it has not and will begin to intensify rapidly again. When it is safe to leave, do not walk through flooded waters. They contain bacteria and may be exposed to live wires.

DO NOT USE ALCOHOL. With any emergency you always need to be clear headed and able to maintain your safety.
